In regards to issues in the news. We are not taking things lightly, but we are also not living in fear. In 1994, When apartheid ended, they thought it would be civil war, but it didn't happen. Now they are saying it again. In regards to our property, there is a new amendment to the constitution that land can be expropriated without compensation to the owner. Our property is registered as a non-profit company. That's the third type of land they will be looking at. So it's way down on the list. I doubt it will get that far. The new president said that land could be taken as long as it doesn't affect the economy. Any land lost will affect the economy. There are millions of questions running around, we are cautious, but not freaked out. We don't know what might happen in the future. But we are caring for 32 children and we have a job to do. Until we get kicked out of the country (who knows what might happen) we will be here taking care of these children. It is business as usual for us. We do keep a sense of heightened security around this place.

We will be leaving for our fund-raising trip on 25 April, and we will send out dates of events in the next newsletter. We have a volunteer who arrives on 8 April and she is staying for 3 months. That will help with the workload in our absence.

Short and long-term volunteers, additional missionaries to meet current needs at The Fold, especially teachers. Long term funding for our school. God's favor for the long term future of The Fold.
